VALCV is a non-partisan political action arm of the Virginia's conservation community. It takes its franchise from the local, regional, and state conservation groups that define the issues and priorities. because most of these groups are 601 (c) (3) status and, therefore, cannot engage in electoral politics, we undertake that effort on their behalf.

We invite you to join our efforts to become the strongest possible political force for conservation in Virginia.

How The Scorecard Votes Were Chosen

Experts from Virginia's conservation organizations made recommendations to VACV on what votes should be included. It was a tough session to summarize because many bills during the 2000 General Assembly session were tabled in committee or carried over until the 2001 session to allow for more public input.

landmark wetlands bills.

matter how hard we try to make our record reflective of a legislator's performance, voting scorecards have limitations. It is difficult to record less tangible elements of lawmaking such as when a bill was difficult for a legislator to make due to political party affiliation or whether a legislator actively "worked" a bill by helping to build support for its message. With carefully chosen votes, a scorecard can give a picture of overall performance.


Overview of the 2000 Session

nontidal wetlands bills dominated environmental discussion during the session. Due to the erosion of federal authority to stem wetlands losses from ditching, Republicans and Democrats from both the House and Senate stepped forward to patronize nontidal wetlands legislation. Despite efforts by the Homebuilder's Association of Virginia to have legislation introduced to diminish protections, the conservation community joined together to keep the focus squarely on the original bills and not allow for a change in the definition of wetlands. Passage of this legislation was truly a victory for all of Virginia's environmental advocates!



2000 General Assembly Vote Key

HOUSE BILL 1170 — Wetlands

Patron — Preston Bryant

Requires that those proposing to impact nontidal wetlands (example: filling or Tulloch ditching) first obtain a Virginia Water Protection Permit from the State Water Control Board. The House floor vote that is tabulated was Delegate Frank Wagner's attempt to limit the wetlands bill to only regulate Tulloch ditching and exempt other potentially damaging impact on nontidal wetlands. The amendment failed (47-Y, 49-N, 2 AB) and the bill was adopted with other minor amendments in the House. The bill sailed through on the Senate side and as signed into law. This is certainly a comprehensive nontidal wetlands bill. *A vote against the Wagner amendment is a "right" vote.*

HOUSE BILL 1223 — Outdoor Advertising

Patron — Donald McEachin

Prohibits the elimination of outdoor advertising structures (billboards) along any highway in the Commonwealth by amortization without just compensation. Passes in the House (86-Y, 13-N) and went on to pass in the Senate along with duplicate SB 522. *A vote against the bill was a "right" vote.*

SENATE BILL 522 — Outdoor Advertising

Patron — Randy Forbes

(identical to HB 1223 listed above)

SENATE BILL 648 — Wetlands

Patron — Mary Margaret Whipple

Comparable to Bryant House bill; The Senate vote shown in the chart is the floor vote on Senator Forbes' amendment which postponed enactment of all provisions covering wetlands impact except those covering Tulloch ditching or excavation for one year until July, 2001. (23-Y, 15-N, 1-AB) *A vote against Senator Forbes' amendment is a "right" vote.* After many versions of this bill were presented and debated, Senator Whipple's bill ultimately was reported out and signed into law. In the House, the vote recorded was for the original Whipple language. *A House vote for the original version of the bill was a "right" vote.*

SENATE BILL 695 — Certificates for alterations of state waters

Patron — Ken Stolle

Certificate for alterations of state water; Senator Stolle proposed this bill as Tulloch-fix only which would have narrowed the scope of Senator's Whipple's comprehensive wetlands bill. While SB 695 passed in the Senate (28-Y, 10-N, 1 AB), it was defeated in the House Committee on Chesapeake and Its Tributaries. (8-Y, 9-N) Whipple's bill, SB 648, then passed the House of Delegates (86-10-1). *A vote against this bill was a "right" vote.*

SENATE BILL 758 — Lease on publicly owned land for communications purposes

Patron — Marty Williams

Lease of publicly owned land for communications purposes; provides detailed criteria for the lease of land by VDOT to communications companies for construction and operations of cell towers. The bill passed on the Senate floor. (19-Y, 18-N, 2-AB) Due to constituent pressure, Senator Williams eventually requested that SB 758 be removed from the House Transportation committee docket. *A vote against this bill on the Senate floor was a "right" vote.* The bill was an attempt to bypass the Supreme Court ruling.
